Thanksgiving Cheese Ball

2 ½ ounce package dried beef, finely chopped

1 tablespoon finely chopped onion Celery leaves

Crackers and/or raw vegetables
In a mixing bowl, beat CREAM CHESE,
pumpkin and pineapple. Stir in CHEDDAR
CHEESE, beef and onion. Shape into a ball;
place on a serving platter. Score sides with a
knife to resemble a pumpkin and add celery
leaves for a stem. Serve with crackers and/or
vegetables. Yield 3 cups.
