Orange Dreamsville Smoothie

2 ½ c. fat-free milk

2 (8-oz) cartons vanilla or orange low-fat yogurt

½ c. fat-free or light dairy sour cream

¼ c. frozen orange juice concentrate, thawed

½ c. (2 scoops) orange sherbet, optional

Directions: In a blender, combine milk, yogurt, sour cream, and orange juice concentrate. Blend on low until smooth. Divide into two tall glasses. Top each with 1 scoop orange sherbet.
