The chemical marketplace has moved to allocating more of its production. In order to ensure that the products you need to protect your crops are available when you need them, it is important to order them early. We are seeing more and more examples of products that cannot be ordered in season. Please don't get caught in the scenario of not having what you need. Call Denny or Jim or Daren Brubaker today. Don't know which item or how much of it you will need? We can help you determine the correct product and appropriate use rates for your operation. This year there are more record keeping requirements for restricted use pesticides (RUP). The important information that you need to know is that when you want to pick up or have RUP delivered, we need the person who is the certified applicator to be present, and provide your pesticide license number and photo id. You may have someone else pick up or receive the product for you, but you must send a signed and dated letter with that person stating that they are allowed to pick up or receive the RUP on your behalf. This person must also show photo id.

CREAM CHEESE FUDGE COOKIES

1 package chocolate fudge cake mix

2 eggs
1/3 cup oil
1-8 ounce package cream cheese
1 cup chocolate chips
1/3 cup sugar

Mix cake mix, one egg and oil to crumbly mixture. Pat all but one cup of cake mixture into the bottom of a 9 x 13 pan. Bake 15 minutes at 350 degrees. While that is baking, mix cream cheese, one egg, and sugar to light, fluffy stage. Mix in chocolate chips. Spread cream cheese mixture over baked bottom portion, top with one cup of remaining cake mixture. Bake for 15 minutes. Cool before cutting.

Soil Testing
